Planning to Move?

If you move, you are required to give the school your new phone number and provide proof of residency. To update your address and phone number sign onto the Student Reservation System (SRS) on the district website, www.pcsb.org, with your ParentCONNECTxp User ID and Password and click on "Change of Address." Or you can visit your assigned school for assistance.

Your child may be moved to a different school. This will depend on seat availability and the distance you would have to travel (i.e. if you moved to Tarpon Springs from St. Petersburg, the district will assign your child to a new school).

School Board's Final Budget Public Hearing

The school board will hold its final public hearing on Sept. 15 regarding the 2009-10 budget. The district's finance team presented a tentative budget and millage rates at the first budget hearing in July. The school board tentatively approved a .25 mill increase, allowed by the state legislature. The additional millage would provide an estimated \$14-million in additional operating revenue. However, the district still needs \$4-million to balance the budget.

Action Steps to Protect Your Child and Family from Swine Flu

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends four main ways you and your family may keep from catching the flu:

1. Practice good hand hygiene by washing your hands often with soap and water.
2. Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze.
3. Stay home if you or your child is sick for at least 24 hours after there is no longer a fever.
4. Get your family vaccinated for seasonal flu and 2009 H1N1 flu when vaccines are available.
